# "VERILY, VERILY, I say unto you, "Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God." John 3:5

This is the third in a series on the Kingdom of God.

Let us lay some groundwork that will lead up to the scripture for this lesson.

- 1. The Kingdom of God is within us in our inner man (our heart and mind). Babylon and the kingdoms of this world are also in our inner man. The kingdoms Christ came to destroy are the kingdoms of this world in the hearts of men and women.
- **2.** The ultimate goal of every human being born is to enter into the Kingdom of Heaven.
- **3.** Christ laid down definite ways of attaining our goal. First we must commit our life to Him. Then we die daily, denying ourselves until we have shed all of our blood, for flesh and blood cannot enter the Kingdom of God (1 Corinthians 15:50). Our life is in our blood. Our life that is conformed to the world must be transformed by the renewing of our mind (Romans 12:2). If we totally commit our life to Christ and follow Him, He will make us a new creation in a new world.

What makes up our life? Our life is our way of thinking, talking, relating, our beliefs and opinions, our talents, deeds and works! After this death to self, then we must enter into a <u>new birth</u>. Do not believe that those who say they are "born again" are really born into the Kingdom of God. Ninety—nine percent of the people who profess to be Christians are really enemies of the cross. The pastors, priests and teachers of the Bible stand as Roman soldiers keeping the people in their graves with their false doctrines. When is America going to awake from her sleep and return to the God that laid the foundation of America?

Recently I heard a well-known preacher giving all his expertise on "The Last Day." "Iraq is Babylon," so

he says. "America will destroy Babylon," so he says, and on and on he went with his idea of the second coming of Christ and the end of the world. Of course, when judgment from God comes and He starts cleaning up America, this preacher is gone to some place in the sky because "he is righteous," so he says. And the rest of us will be here allowing God to cleanse our temple and partake of the suffering that will ultimately make us that abode for God to dwell in.

Now this preacher calls all of us wicked, and he is righteous. What arrogance! What deceit! How can intelligent Bible reading Christians reconcile that kind of gospel with the Bible? It reminds me of a time 2000 years ago when Christ said to the Pharisees, "You search the scriptures in search of me and I am standing in your midst" (John 5:39).

There is a Saddam Hussein lurking in the heart of every individual of the human race. Let us not seek to escape the fiery judgments that will cleanse our hearts, but let us instead embrace the great tribulation and suffering and sorrow that cleanses us of every spot and blemish, making our hearts a pure home for a most holy God (1 Peter 5:10, 2 Peter 3:14).

Is your hope "Christ perfected in you" or do you have false hopes such as a "rapture" or some other doctrine that keeps the cross from doing its work in you? Beware, lest you reap the fruit of your perverted hopes. Believe me when I tell you, if you are sitting under the teaching of a false teacher, you are unprepared for the next move of God.

The day of the Lord is here. Now is the hour to enter in. Today is the day of your salvation. So we must be born of water like Moses when he left Egypt, or Abraham when he followed God out of his father's house. We too must leave our old place of worship, our father's house — coming out of our old life, we are born of water. Then at the cross we are born of the Spirit, changed from mortal to immortality with His incorruptible blood. There at the cross we are born of God and become the children of God.

Remember, people of America, democracy is no different from communism <u>once God is removed from government</u>. He has already been banished from the churches. We <u>must</u> wake up and seek Him while He yet may be found. America — if you hear the cry of the Spirit — REPENT, for the Kingdom of God is at hand.
