Overcoming

*“In the world you shall have tribulation —
But be of good cheer I have overcome the world.” John 16:33*

Considering that we are all born in what the Bible calls hell and the grave and “the gates of hell shall not prevail against us”, the above scripture is indeed a most comforting one.

Shortly we will see our “night of pleasure turned into the torment of hell.” Our country is worse than


July — September 2005 Letter
