“Consider the lilies how they grow, they spin not, they toil not and yet I say unto you, that Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these.” Luke 12:27

What a scripture!!! God comparing Solomon, with all his possessions and all his glory — perhaps the greatest the Adam man can be, and it is nothing compared to the lilies of the field. Can you guess why??? Or should I say, “Do you know why?”

Recently I saw the movie “Pearl Harbor”. Isn't it interesting that just now, sixty years after the happening, they have made this film that people are flocking to see???

Consider these facts: It happened on the Sabbath. Did Jesus not warn us to pray that His coming happen not on the Sabbath?? It happened on the seventh day of the twelfth month — seven being a complete number, twelve, the number of governments and also the month we celebrate the birth of the Lord. I would like to draw an analogy of what happened at Pearl Harbor and how the church is today.

He admonishes us to sell what we have, yet I see the people of the Charismatic move building bigger barns, preparing for something which will never happen — fools, who this night, their souls will be required of them.

God has admonished us to empty our hearts so He can fill them. I know of no pastor who does not have his heart full of idols so there is no room for the coming of the Lord. He again warns that these people will “be cut asunder and have his portion with the unbelievers.” The anointing has left the Charismatic move. They are all busy doing and have failed to become — become that new creation — the glorious risen Christ.
